As a research radiographer I split my time between my clinical work in radiology, where I specialise in CT scanning, and my research related activities. I am fortunate to be involved with a number of the research teams, especially oncology, orthopaedics and rheumatology, as a number of their clinical trials require participants to have specific scans and x-rays. Working with teams outside of radiology has been a great experience, and I have learned a huge amount from my colleagues about their specialities and how radiology imaging impacts research, as well as the research processes within the NHS.
