I am a Registered Adult Nurse, having trained at Addenbrooke's Hospital in Cambridge. I specialised in Oncology Nursing and then in palliative care and have worked in the NHS and voluntary sector settings. I have held senior leadership positions for Marie Curie Cancer Care, where I completed my MSc in Nursing Research and Practice Development. It was through this that I developed my knowledge about research and how to lead change in practice.

I held my first Director of Nursing position in NHS Shetland Health Board and before joining University Hospitals Coventry and Warwickshire NHS Trust I was Director of Nursing at Bedford Hospital NHS Trust for four years. I am committed to widening research opportunities for our Nurses, Midwives and AHPs

including offering innovative clinical academic career pathways. In order to achieve that I have led the development of our integrated Clinical Academic health Research Excellence (iCAhRE™) programme. I am extremely proud that many of our staff have secured national funding awards through this scheme.

At the time of writing this, UHCW and Coventry University have launched our innovative Centre for Care Excellence with 5 Professors and Associate Professors having been appointed to lead this work going forward. The Centre will act as a catalyst for excellence in practice, research and education. It is not only ground breaking, but the right thing to do for both our staff and patients.
