# **Early Arthritis Education Group**

You have been invited to the Early Arthritis Education Group.

The group meets on a set Friday, from 10.30am to 12.30pm in the Rheumatology Gym. The group session will be presented by the therapy staff.

Please bring a family member with you if you think it will help.

The presentation is an interactive session. This means there will be time for you to ask questions.

## What will this session involve?

### Introduction to arthritis

You will learn more about your condition and what causes the pain, stiffness, and fatigue you may experience.

# Advice on flare-ups

We will give you advice on when and how to use ice and heat safely on your joints.

#### Advice on exercise

We will give you advice on exercise for people with arthritis and how to keep your joints moving to prevent stiffness and loss of movement.

## Advice on looking after your feet

We will give you advice on how to look after your feet and what to look for when choosing good footwear.

# Joint protection techniques

We will show you ways of doing activities that can help prevent damage to your joints, make tasks easier and less painful.



## Self-help information and coping strategies

We will provide information to help you manage your condition and maximise what you can do each day. This will include information on how to pace yourself and get a good balance between activity and rest.

#### **Practical issues**

There will be time to discuss practical, everyday home and work issues and their possible solutions.

# Your appointment

You will be referred to the group by your consultant. We will send you a letter with your appointment date. This can be changed if the date is not convenient.

The group usually meets every 7 weeks on a Friday, from 10.30am to 12.30pm. This can depend on there being enough people booked to attend.

You can book follow-up sessions with a physiotherapist or occupational therapist if necessary.
