### Conditions and treatments

Our Cancer Information Specialists can offer free support, practical advice and information to anyone affected by cancer including family and friends. No appointment is needed, and an answering machine facility is available. The service is open Monday to Friday 8am to 4pm excluding bank holidays

### Hospital car parking

Patients receiving ongoing chemotherapy and radiotherapy as an outpatient will receive free car parking and some patients may be entitled to reimbursement of their travel expenses if they receive certain benefits – please ask for details.

### Free prescriptions

Patients diagnosed with cancer or who continue to be affected by the side effects of disease or treatment are entitled to free prescriptions, please ask about an exemption certificate.
