Nystatin: Information for kidney transplant patients

What is it used for?

When your immune system is suppressed you may become more prone to mouth infections. Nystatin is an anti-fungal liquid that helps to prevent this infection.

How does it work?

It works by preventing the fungus responsible for mouth infections from increasing and causing infection.

How do I take it?

You should measure 1 to 5ml using the oral syringe and rinse around the mouth and then swallow once daily for the first six months after your transplant. Nystatin is available as a 100,000 units in 1ml suspension.

Are there any side effects?

Side effects are rare, but you may have a mild upset stomach with sickness and indigestion.
