Nystatin: Information for kidney transplant patients

What is Nystatin used for?

You may become more prone to mouth infections when your immune system is suppressed. Nystatin is an anti-fungal liquid that helps prevent mouth infection.

How does Nystatin work?

It works by preventing the fungus responsible for mouth infections from causing infection.

How to take Nystatin

You should measure 5ml using the oral syringe and rinse around your mouth, then swallow once a day. You should do this for the first 6 months after your transplant. Nystatin is available as a 100,000 units in 1ml suspension.

Side effects

Side effects are rare. You may have a mild upset stomach with sickness and indigestion.

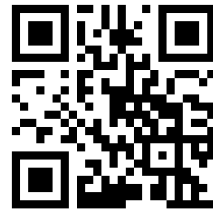
