# Clinical nurse specialist in Urology

### Introduction

The Clinical Nurse Specialists for Urology are experienced trained nurses who can provide detailed information about the urinary system, urological complaints, and cancers. Within their role they work closely with the Urology ward and the Urology doctors. The nurses can help patients with an explanation, discuss the treatments that are available and have been offered by the consultant and assist in symptom management and treatment of side effects. The Clinical Nurse Specialists can also provide emotional support for patients and their relatives. They also have other skills and are responsible for outpatient clinics, as well as teaching colleagues.

### Clinical Nurse Specialist for Continence and Urology

Sarah Roth is the Clinical Nurse Specialist who deals with continence problems in women. She is responsible for outpatient clinics such as Urodynamics (a specialised bladder test), erectile dysfunction and female continence assessments. She has a detailed knowledge of continence and other urology related problems. Sarah can help with issues with urinary catheters and is able to teach patients to pass their own catheters intermittently.

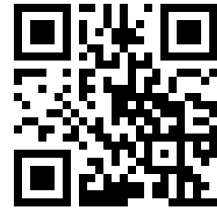
