Urine flow test and bladder scan

Your Consultant Urologist/Clinical Nurse Specialist has referred you to have a Urine Flow Test and Bladder Scan because you are having urinary problems.

The following information explains the investigations that we will do.

What to Expect

When you arrive for your tests, you will be asked to wait in an area at the end of the clinic corridor. A nurse will see you as soon as possible. Please be aware that you could be with us for around 2 hours or more.

Bladder Scan

This is an ultrasound scan of your bladder and may be done before and after you have your urine flow test. The purpose of the scan is to find out how well you empty your bladder. The test involves passing an ultrasound sensor over your abdomen and is painless.



Urine Flow Test

This test is designed to find out what volume of urine you pass and the rate at which you empty your bladder. You will be asked to pass urine into a container and a graph will be printed out, showing the amount of urine passed and the rate of flow of urine. You may be asked to do this test twice.

For these tests to be effective you will need to have a full bladder. If possible, please arrive at the hospital with a comfortably full bladder and do not empty your bladder before you see the clinic nurse. You may be asked to drink more fluids at the hospital. In hot weather, please drink extra fluids. If your bladder is not full at the time of your appointment, you may be delayed.
