# Gynaecology: Colposcopy Unit Surgicel Gauze

## What is Surgicel?

Surgicel is a sterile absorbable piece of gauze that has two benefits:

- It acts like a blood clot when this is needed to assist in the control of bleeding.
- It kills bacteria, which helps to prevent infection.

Surgicel has been widely used in surgical procedures such as tooth extractions, nose bleeds and general surgery and can be used within the vagina quite safely.

The Surgicel gauze we use is about the size of your little finger and swells into a black jelly like lump when placed in blood.

## Why did I need Surgicel?

The doctor or nurse who performed your treatment today would have used the Surgicel gauze because the bleeding from your biopsy took longer to control than normal. Using Surgicel offers more protection from continued bleeding and infection.

#### What can I expect?

Surgicel swells up inside the vagina and forms a black jelly like clot which you may notice later in the day when you go to the toilet. The clot should not be bigger than your middle finger. It is not always passed as a small clot and may be partially reabsorbed so you may be unaware it is in place. It should not cause you any discomfort.
