Skin Prick Testing

Your child has been referred to the allergy nurse for Skin Prick Testing to confirm a diagnosis, or Epipen training (if this is appropriate) following diagnosis.

You should receive an appointment for this shortly.

What to expect

The skin prick test is a common test used to determine any allergy.

- Small amounts of diluted solution of the suspected allergen (food/pollen/animal hair) are gently pricked onto the skin of the forearm or back. We would only use the back if your child has severe eczema on the forearm.
- There won't be any blood!
- We try and keep the children occupied during the test which, while not painful, does feel strange.
- A small raised area may appear on the skin and this will be measured after 15 minutes.
- The results will then be fully discussed.
- Although the test itself is short, please be prepared for a consultation to last about an hour.
- We prefer that the child has nothing to eat or drink during the skin prick testing other than water.

Before your appointment

• No creams should be applied to the forearm for 24 hours prior to testing as this may also adversely affect the reading.

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- In order to obtain a true result it is vital that your child has no antihistamine medication for at least 2 days prior to the appointment.
- A longer length of time may be needed for certain anti-histamines as the readings may be affected. Please see below
- It is not necessary to stop asthma inhalers

Anti-histamine to be stopped before the test

Short acting antihistamines such as Phenergan, Vallergan and Piriton should be stopped **2 days before** the test

Longer acting antihistamines such as Loratidine and Cetirizine should be stopped **4 days before** the test.

Please speak to the allergy nurses if your child is on **any other medication**, if you have any concerns or need clarification about the test and stopping the medication. They can be contacted by email on; <u>childrensallergy@uhcw.nhs.uk</u>
