Disability Living Allowance / Personal Independence Payment

Disability Living Allowance (DLA)

If your child is 15 or under and has extra care or mobility needs due to a medical need, you can apply for Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for them. If they're 16 or over they would need to apply for **Personal Independence Payment (PIP).**

DLA is a benefit to help with the extra costs of raising a child with a medical need. It takes into account your child's mobility and care needs. DLA is not means-tested.

Care component

- lowest rate help for some of the day
- middle rate frequent help / constant supervision either in the day or at night
- highest rate help/ supervision both day and night

If your child is awarded DLA, you may qualify for Carer's Allowance

Eligibility

Usually, to qualify for Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for children the child must:

- be under 16
- need extra looking after or have walking difficulties



Patient Information

- be in Great Britain, another European Economic Area (EEA) country or Switzerland when you claim - there are some exceptions, such as family members of the Armed Forces
- have lived in Great Britain for 2 of the last 3 years, if over 3 years old
- be habitually resident in the UK, Ireland, Isle of Man or the Channel Islands
- not be subject to immigration control

There are some exceptions to these conditions if the child is **living or** coming from another EEA country or Switzerland.

You can claim DLA for children if you're in or out of work.

Children under 3

A child under 6 months must have lived in Great Britain for at least 13 weeks.

A child aged between 6 months and 3 years must have lived in Great Britain for at least 26 of the last 156 weeks.

Claiming DLA for a child

You can either:

Your claim date will be the date you call and ask for the form, if you complete and return it in the time given. If you download a claim form, it will be the date your completed form is received.

Personal Independence Payment (PIP)

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) was introduced in 2013 to replace Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for new claimants ages 16 to 64. PIP is not means-tested and isn't affected by earnings, other income or savings.

PIP assessments

Existing Disability Living Allowance claimants are only reassessed if:

- An existing DLA claimant's fixed-term award is ending soon.
- An existing applicant is approaching age 16.
- The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) receives information about a change in their care or mobility.

From October 2015 all working-aged people still receiving DLA will be reassessed and if their claim is successful, moved onto PIP.

If you were 65 or over on 8 April 2013 and receiving DLA, you can continue to receive it if you satisfy the entitlement conditions.

When applying for your PIP you will be asked for information such as:

- Contact details and date of birth
- National Insurance number
- Bank or Building Society details
- Doctors or health workers name
