Holidays

- If you are travelling overseas, you will need a **sharps letter** from your P.D.S.N. (Paediatric Diabetes Specialist Nurse). This will enable you to carry sharps with you on your journey.
- You must carry all your medication and equipment that you use for the management of your diabetes **in your hand luggage**.
- You should have a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC) to cover you in case of emergencies. Apply online: [Applying for healthcare cover abroad \(GHIC and EHIC\) - NHS \(www.nhs.uk\)](https://www.nhs.uk/apply-for-ghic)
- It is advisable that you take double the amount you need and split it with a travel companion if able, just in case one lot gets damaged or lost.
- You will probably need to reduce your dose of insulin while you are on holiday due to extremes in weather, exercise, and excitement. Contact your diabetes Team before you travel for advice on dose adjustments for holidays
- Take your P.D.S.N contact numbers in case you need advice while you are away.
- Most importantly, **have fun!**
