When: 1st and 3rd Wednesday morning of each month

St Cross Hospital Rugby

Children and young person's clinic

Where: Children's Outpatients Department and for Young Person's

Transition Clinic, The Diabetes centre (Swift House)

When: 2nd, 3rd and 4th Friday morning of each month

Young person's Diabetes clinic

Where: Swift House, Diabetes Centre When: Quarterly on Friday morning's



Patient Information

Before you come to clinic you must remember to bring with you:

- Your blood glucose meter
- Your blood glucose diary, filled in with all your blood glucose results
- The Information folder given to you at diagnosis
- A list of questions you want to ask the Diabetes Team
- Snack and hypo treatment
- Something to do while you wait

If you are able to, please upload your meter or pump to Diasend (please contact the Diabetes Team if you need help with this)

When you arrive at clinic you need to book in at reception:

- An out-patients nurse will check your height, weight. They may also do your blood pressure (at least once a year).
- There will be leaflets to read and take home if you wish, so feel free to browse.
- You will be seen by Dr Karthikeyan, Dr Malik, Dr Sankar or a locum consultant. Dr Stirling, Dr Karthikeyan, Dr Sankar or a Registrar. They will discuss your control and management of your diabetes, look at your blood glucose results, help you with any problems you may be experiencing and inform you of any new information about diabetes.
- You can see the paediatric dietician who will give you dietary advice.
- If you need/want to see the Psychologist it may be possible at clinic or can be arranged for another time.
- The Paediatric Diabetes Specialist Nurses, will always be at clinic to advise and assist with any problems concerning your diabetes.
- Every 3 months you will need a blood test called an HbA1c, this will be carried out at your appointment and you will be able to discuss the result in clinic.

Patient Information

 Once a year you will have another blood test taken to assess your overall health. Ametop Gel (Magic cream) or a cold spray, to numb the area, is available so just ask us if you want to use it. You may need to book this appointment online at:
