## **Service information**

#### The service aim

Our service aim is to offer high quality care while considering our patients' physical, social, psychological and spiritual needs. We aim to promote our patients' health and. We can also signpost patients and parents who are planning a family. Your cultural and ethical beliefs and confidentiality are always respected. Our staff are supported with specialist training so that they are continually developing their skills.

#### Sickle cell disease and thalassaemia

Sickle cell disease and thalassaemia are the names we give to a group of related genetic conditions that affect the production of haemoglobin. Haemoglobin is the substance in our red blood cells that carries oxygen around the body.

These diseases may also be referred to as "Haemoglobinopathies".

#### Our service users

Most of our patients live in Coventry. However, UHCW also provides some specialist services for patients from across Warwickshire.

#### **Emergency Service and Out of Hours**

If you or your child has a sickle cell crisis or feeling unwell and you are unable to resolve the problem at home, go to the Children's Emergency Department and let the staff know that you have Sickle Cell Disease or Thalassaemia.

The staff in the emergency department will contact the on-call specialist doctor (haematologist). The specialist team will also be notified by our alert system. Please bring your personalised care plan (if you have one) to help us plan your treatment.

# Please bring any medication your child is taking and your child's red book to all appointments with a doctor or nurse.

#### Our services:

- Specialist consultant and nurses.
- Co-ordination of care for people affected by Sickle Cell & Thalassaemia.
- Clinics that provide specialist medical reviews for affected children on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month between 9am - 12pm
- Joint children's clinic with a haematology specialist from Birmingham Children's Hospital every 3-6 months.
- Transcranial Doppler screening clinics to measure the blood flow in the brain.
- Link nurses on the wards.
- Training and education for patients, parents, and health professionals
- Support parents and schools with developing care plans and education.
- Home visits.
- Phlebotomy service at UHCW to have blood taken for testing.
- Auditing and research. Including the support of the National Haemoglobinopathy Register.
- Links with the Children's Emergency Department
- Referrals and links with specialist services, including Endocrinology, heart specialists (Cardiology), Kidney specialists (Renal), Urology, Orthopaedic, and Maternity Specialists.
- Sign-posting to welfare and other social services

The West Midlands Paediatric Haemoglobinopathy Network (WMPHN) was launched on 23 May 2016. The aim of the WMPHN is to bring about improved and standardised care for patients with cell disease and thalassaemia living within the West Midlands area.
