I have published over 100 papers in leading peer-reviewed journals (H-index 31; i10-index 51), including a recent paper in Lancet Diabetes and Endocrinology on ethnic-specific cut-points for obesity. I also present regularly as an invited speaker at scientific meetings both nationally and internationally. I tend to engage regularly with national media on topics relating to human metabolism and Obesity.

Recently, my research on Mindfulness application in Obesity management in a tier 3 Obesity service, published in *Journal of Clinical Endocrinology and Metabolism*, received international media interest in over 50 outlets. As scientific lead for the Human Metabolism Research Unit, my current research interests include the impact of human metabolism on the development of Obesity, and novel strategies to prevent and manage Obesity and Diabetes Mellitus within the populace. As Clinical Lead for the Obesity service at UHCW, I combine clinical duties with clinical and translational research.
